Bible readings

Luke 8:1-3 ~ Joyce Hunt, All Souls'

¹After this, Jesus travelled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. The Twelve were with him, ²and also some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases: Mary (called Magdalene) from whom seven demons had come out; ³Joanna the wife of Cuza, the manager of Herod's household; Susanna; and many others. These women were helping to support them out of their own means.

Acts 12:6-17 – Dramatised reading

⁶The night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries stood guard at the entrance. ⁷Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He struck Peter on the side and woke him up. "Quick, get up!" he said, and the chains fell off Peter's wrists.

⁸Then the angel said to him, "Put on your clothes and sandals." And Peter did so. "Wrap your cloak around you and follow me," the angel told him. ⁹Peter followed him out of the prison, but he had no idea that what the angel was doing was really happening; he thought he was seeing a vision.

¹⁰They passed the first and second guards and came to the iron gate leading to the city. It opened for them by itself, and they went through it. When they had walked the length of one street, suddenly the angel left him.

¹¹Then Peter came to himself and said, "Now I know without a doubt that the Lord sent his angel and rescued me from Herod's clutches and from everything the Jewish people were anticipating."

¹²When this had dawned on him, he went to the house of Mary the mother of John, also called Mark, where many people had gathered and were praying. ¹³Peter knocked at the outer entrance, and a servant girl named Rhoda came to answer the door. ¹⁴When she recognized Peter's voice, she was so overjoyed she ran back without opening it and exclaimed, "Peter is at the door!"

¹⁵"You're out of your mind," they told her. When she kept insisting that it was so, they said, "It must be his angel."

¹⁶But Peter kept on knocking, and when they opened the door and saw him, they were astonished. ¹⁷Peter motioned with his hand for them to be quiet and described how the Lord had brought him out of prison. "Tell James and the brothers about this," he said, and then he left for another place.

Powerful Prayers

You are in prison. And you need to escape. But the only things you have to help you escape are the things directly to your right, right now.

What is it? Maybe your morning coffee, maybe a notebook and pen, stuffed animal, family member. How are you going to escape?

Well, our reading today begins with a prison escape. But Peter didn't use a ball point pen and a straw. He didn't even use his favourite teddy bear. No, Peter didn't even free himself – he was freed by an Angel.

We find Peter in prison, chains on both arms, two guards standing outside at the entrance or exit. And an angel appears, wakes Peter up and releases him from his chains and they simply walk out the jail as the big iron gates swing open for them.

Just imagine what that would have been like, Peter himself at the time didn't even believe it, he thought he was dreaming. What an amazing miracle. Just look at the power of God on show: a shining angel, chains breaking, guards being oblivious, I think, Iron gates swinging open. Just amazing, but God didn't just wake up one day and decide to break Peter out of Jail. We see if we read verse 5, it started with prayer.



A little way away from the prison was a house where a group of Christians were gathered earnestly praying. We don't know much about who was in this house or what their prayer was like, whether it was quiet whispers or shouting and dancing, but we do hear about two of the participants.

Firstly, we hear about a woman called Mary who was the mother of John Mark, surely a faithful follower of Jesus. She was so dedicated to Jesus that she was willing to give up her home for the Church. Even in a time of persecution, Mary gave up her home for people to come and meet, worship and earnestly pray and I don't think this would have been a simple hour or two prayer meeting.

I am fairly confident in saying that this would have been hours and hours, even days. She would have been welcoming people, possibly as high as 40, into her home – not for an evening but for the whole day, whole

night. All to pray, to intercede on behalf of Peter, trapped in prison about to go on trial.

It puts many of us, including myself, to shame when we see the way the early church prayed and the dedication of Mary to the Church.

The second person we are introduced to is Rhoda, Rhoda is a servant but lives up to none of the expectation we may have of how servants would have been treated or behaved.

She was treated; by my reading, to be an equal part of the church. She knew who Peter was, she was overjoyed in seeing him and went back into the room shouting about Peter being at the door. I imagine that she was there praying with everyone else, sitting by the door, ready to serve as her servant duty required. But not treated as a servant, only there to serve as an inferior, but a maid who had a job to do but welcome as a fellow member of the body of Christ.

To picture this scene, we need to make some assumptions, so these are my assumptions. You may image the scene differently.

We are in the house of Mary, obviously a rich woman to have owned a house. She hosted the meeting, making people feel welcome and comfortable in her home. Her home is full of people. The Church had grown to thousands, spread around many homes each full of people praying and worshiping. So, Mary's home is full - every chair, every piece of floor is taken up. Some standing, some sitting, some possibly leaning out the window. There are men and women of many different backgrounds maybe there are children asleep on the floor. They have been praying since the morning and it's now 11pm, but they do not cease. They continue to pray for Peter's release. Yet even though they are together, all praying for the same thing, their belief that God will answer their prayer is perhaps, small. Rhoda is there sitting at the edge, praying even while she fetches drinks and food for the group.

Each individual is doing something they think is so small. Mary giving up her home - does she really think it has the power to impact Peter's release? Rhoda serving those present - does she really think her job will aid in Peter's release? The rest praying earnestly but not really believing they are thinking it will make any difference.

Yet little do they know one by one their prayers are building up and with the power of God will break Peter free.

Throughout our sermon series, we have explored many characters, some faithful some not so faithful. But we gave the sermon series the name: The ordinary and the extraordinary.

Here we have two individuals in our reading. Both women, deemed lesser in their time, one a servant placed even lower. Yet their actions, which they thought were ordinary, turned with the power of God into the extraordinary.

A woman who gave up her home, a servant girl doing her job. Both praying along with the rest of the Church, by the power of the Spirit breaking Peter out of jail.
