Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God.

⁶You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. ₇Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die.

⁸But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! ¹⁰For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more,

having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

Talk and confession – Robin and Nicola

Naaman was an army commander.

He was loved by the king because he was so good at conquering other nations.

But Naaman was not a servant of God and he even went and raided parts of Israel, God's land and he had captured and enslaved some of the Israelites, Gods people.

Naaman was not a very nice man to God or his people.

Naaman was also not very well. Naaman had a skin condition called leprosy which meant he had dry itchy white patches on his skin.

One of the Israelites whom Naaman had captured was a girl who worked for him. She was a good servant and wanted her master, Naaman, to be healed so she told him that if he went to Samaria and found the prophet there, he could be healed.

Naaman went at once bringing with him presents and gifts for the person who could heal him.

Naaman excitedly knocked at the door of the prophet Elisha.

Elisha sent out a messenger to tell Naaman to wash himself in the local river 7 times and then God will heal him.

Well, what do you think Naaman did? Run to the river and wash himself?... well no. Naaman was too proud for that. He thought too much of himself. He thought "I'm Naaman the great commander of King Aram, I demand to be spoken to by Elisha not just his messenger. I demand that he comes out and calls on the name of the lord, wave his hands over my body to heal me, I'm not going to wash in the river Jordan I'm too important and I have better rivers back home".

Naaman was proud and angry. He raided many different towns, and captured people – forcing them to leave their homes. He was not a very nice person.

Are you ever like Naaman, are you ever unkind? Are you ever unfriendly? Are you ever unhelpful? Are you ever unloving? Are you ever uncaring? Are you ever unwelcoming? Are you ever ungrateful?

Well Jesus told us that even when we are any of these un-words, when we do bad things, we can come to him and say sorry and he will forgive us and help us to change.

Take some time to think about those un-words we mentioned, have you been any of those things this week?

So, we say sorry to God, and ask God to turn: our unkind, into kind. Our unfriendly into friendly. Our unhelpful into helpful. Our unloving into loving. Our uncaring into caring. Our unwelcoming into welcoming. Our ungrateful into grateful.

Back to our story, do you remember that Naaman was angry? He was very angry, but his servant managed to calm his master down and makes him wash in the river.

When we come before God and say sorry, he forgives all of our sins – all those un-words. And just like he takes our sins away, God chose to heal Naaman – to take his leprosy away. Naaman washed in the river 7 times, and he was healed – his leprosy was gone.

Naaman went running back to Elisha to say Thank you and Elisha told him not to thank him but to thank the lord God. So Naaman does and promises only to worship the Lord God from now on taking soil from Samaria home to make an altar.

Our God is wonderful loving god. In fact, he is so loving that he loves even those who hurt him.

Imagine someone came knocking at your door, and this man asks for help. You recognise him, you have seen him hurt other people. And he starts to shout at you saying how wonderful he is and how important he is, he gets angry at you. Do you help him?

God says he would. God says he did.

In the Bible, in Paul's letter to the Romans – in chapter 5 he says these famous words:

'While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.'

While we, you and I were sinners, whilst we were unkind and unloving and turned away from God, Jesus died for us on the cross so that we could be forgiven and have a relationship with God.

Do you remember how Naaman reacted when he was healed? He was full of joy, celebrating, thanking God and praising him.

Paul tells us that this is also how we should respond when we know that Jesus died for us so that we could be forgiven.

God chose to reconcile us to him – to bring us back together.

Paul says, 'For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son,..'

That's amazing! That when we sin, when we do bad things, unkind things, unloving things, like Naaman there is a barrier stopping us being friends with God, but Jesus came down and even though we were mean to him, he died so we could be friends with God again and be washed clean. Just like Naaman.

How amazing, how wonderful and great reason to praise God just as Naaman did.
