Ezekiel 34:11-16- Mark Lemprière, St Mark's

11" 'For this is what the Sovereign LORD says: I myself will search for my sheep and look after them. 12As



a shepherd looks after his scattered flock when he is with them, so will I look after my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and darkness. ¹³I will bring them out from the nations and gather them from the countries, and I will bring them into their own land. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life--only to take it up again.

Sermon – Rev Sam Waako - Security and Joy

This week I'm continuing with our sermon series this Lent looking at 'Spiritual essentials for real life', and the focus this week is on 'Finding security', ultimately in Jesus, who promises and invites us to a life of both permanent and solid security and joy.

Various dictionaries have different definitions for security, but the one that caught my attention especially for the purpose of this talk, is the one that defined security as, "a state of being or feeling secure; freedom from fear, anxiety, danger, doubt etc; a state or sense of safety or certainty."

With this definition in mind, I immediately begun to reflect on things on me that speak of my earthly securities; I looked at my wedding ring and thought of my relationships, my wife who perhaps without her, I highly doubt I would have turned out to be the person I have become if it was not for the support and the security, I have in her. And as it's mothering Sunday, I also thought about my Mum who up to this day finds it difficult to believe that I am grown up but whose prayers and support I continue to value tremendously. On mothering Sunday as well, we also reflect on the 'Mother Church', this was the original tradition from the 16th century, when people on every fourth Sunday of Lent would return to their Mother Church for a special service. The 'Mother -Church' offered and continues to offer a sense of belonging and security that many people have missed during this lockdown.

I then looked in my wallet and was surprisingly amazed by how many cards (some of which were useless) I had. But two stood out for me; one was my bank card and the other a 'Bio metric card. The latter simply means I have the security to live in this country, work, have all the privileges any national would have. I only managed to get this card in 2017 after 8 years of living in this country. Prior to this, among other things, I had to pay for the NHS, I only had right to stay in this country if I had a job (if I didn't have a job I had 14/28 days to leave), I had to renew my visa, sometimes every year costing me lots of money, and I couldn't even be ordained without this card...and I can guarantee you, that's not the way to live.

But the thing with all these securities, great as some of these might be, all these things am sure we all agree are fragile, they can be attained and lost in just a moment.

Our Bible readings this week once again remind us that only Jesus offers us the security and stability that we need, not just in this life, but for eternal life as well.

Jesus is the source of our permanent, solid security and ultimately our deepest joy. Why? Because He loves us completely, and joy comes ultimately from being loved. And the love of Jesus is love that is perfect and eternal.

So far in this series we have heard Jesus refer to himself as; 'The way the truth and the life',

'the bread of life', the light of the world', and in our gospel reading in John 10.7-17, Jesus refers to Himself as both the gate (door in other translations) and the good shepherd to the sheep (His followers).

And I found the setting of this passage really helpful to understand what Jesus was trying to communicate to His



audience. Jesus was in a village setting, in the open country, where shepherds led the sheep for grazing. Overnight, the sheep were placed in a roughly constructed round stone walled enclosure. Inside the closure, the sheep were safe as long as the entrance was secured by the shepherd ~ who especially in small sheep pens, slept across the entrance as there was no door and no door keeper.

In this type of sheep pen, the shepherd also functioned as the gate, letting the sheep in and protecting them. Jesus is the gate to God's salvation for us. He offers us access to safety and security. Christ is our protector. In John 14.6 Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the father except through me."

And I speak from experience when I say Jesus truly gives life. The life He gives now is abundantly richer and fuller, and not just that, it's eternal and yet begins immediately. And this is because of His overflowing forgiveness, love, guidance, security and so on

In the Ezekiel reading, the verbs that demonstrate what the good shepherd does include searching, seeking, deliver, gather, feed, strengthen and so on... God promises to look after His sheep (that is you and me), providing for them with good pasture, caring for the injured and weak, and shepherding the flock with Justice.

And our response to all of this is to recognise the two characteristics mentioned in both these passages about the sheep.

1) They realize that a full life, both now and eternally can only be found in Jesus. Everything else is a bonus. In fact, Matthew 6.33, one of my favourite Bible passages, Jesus says, "...seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things (our other securities) will be given to you as well."

All the things I mentioned at the start, great as some of them can be, they will never be enough. We have all heard of the story of Shamim Begum, who I suppose had a Bio metric card like mine at some point, but now no longer has the security of citizenship it offers. Only Jesus can offer us permanent residence in the Kingdom and security and joy.

2) His sheep know His voice and follow Him.

I've never looked after sheep but I grew up looking after cattle during my school holidays staying with my grandparents, some herds had over 200 cows, with just two of us taking them sometimes for miles looking for green pastures. But these cows, however far they would wonder off, one single sound of what I would say is equivalent to whistling but a bit

louder, they would all gather to wherever the sound came from. Because they had been accustomed and tuned in to this sound.

And Jesus says, His sheep know His voice, and not just that, they follow Him. When these cows heard this sound, they followed... we just have to pray for a spirit of obedience to the voice of God, and to give us the boldness to do all He has called us to do.

The good news is that Jesus has already laid down His life for His sheep, he has conquered death, and now we are invited and offered this security balanced with Joy. Let our hope and trust ultimately be in the one that is truly solid and truly permanent.
