

* HIGHLIGHTS OF PCC MEETING ON 20 MARCH *

- we agreed a financial reserves policy, so that we always have £50,000, approximately 3 month's expenditure, in the parish account as a contingency against unexpected costs or a sudden reduction in income.
- we passed a formal resolution, required by the Diocese of Guildford, agreeing to support Rachel Johnson in her ministerial training when she begins as a Licensed Lay Minister in June
- we discussed the requirements for the new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and agreed a statement that we are committed to implementing it and will draw up a policy for October's PCC meeting

* AUTISM AWARENESS COFFEE MORNING *

We had a very successful coffee morning with some lovely homemade cakes to raise awareness and funds for autism, as part of the national Autism Awareness week, which was attended by local parents and carers.

Over £100 was raised for the NAS which will be used to support local autistic people and their families, plus some funds for Raise the Roof.

VICAR'S VIEW

Good Friday was a 'cross' sort of day for me. Hot cross buns in the morning, walking with the cross from St Peter's, an excellent, but wet, dramatic retelling of the crucifixion in Woking Town Centre (followed by more hot cross buns!), reading a reflection on the horrors of crucifixion, leading a reflection on the three crosses at Calvary at All Souls' and then watching the last part of Wintershall's The Passion of Jesus broadcast live from Trafalgar Square via Facebook. While I may have overdone it a little, it is important to spend time entering into the events of that Friday and reflecting on the cross, because Easter Sunday is nothing without the cross.

Without death there is no resurrection. Most good stories have an enemy or a tragedy that seemingly can't be overcome, before ending with a dramatic victory. The story would be nothing if there were no drama, the emotions would be untouched. So the joy of Easter is that the cross was not the end for Jesus, as it was for the thousands of its victims over the centuries. It was the opportunity for God to demonstrate his power over death and the devil, to vindicate who Jesus was and to verify the hope of eternal life. Alleluia, Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, Alleluia! Ionathan
