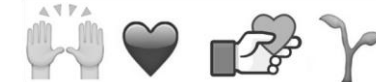

## \* RESTORE AND REBUILD – A POST ABORTION HEALING COURSE \*

Achor is running another post abortion healing course starting on Thursday 20 September 2018 at 7.30 pm. It will be held in a home in Woking over 9 sessions plus one whole Saturday. They ran their first course using the *Restore and Rebuild* material last autumn and said it was thrilling to see God working in the lives of those attending.

*Restore and Rebuild* is a course is for women who have been through one or more abortions, are Christians, and who wish to receive healing and restoration in this area of their lives. The course offers a safe place for women to share their experiences in a small group setting and, step-by-step, work though different emotions and consequences following an abortion. Confidentiality is always respected.

Achor says “Many of those who had an abortion when they were Christians tell us that they feel that they have lost their faith or feel distant from God. We recommend that you come on the course even if you feel unsure about your faith. We will not judge you. We seek to welcome you into a warm, loving group with God’s grace in Christ. Even if you feel far from God at the moment, come as you are now.”

## \* OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOXES \*



We are participating in this initiative again this year. Our boxes will need to be ready by Sunday 18 November. Details of what can (and cannot!) be included in the boxes are given in the leaflets that will be available in all three of our churches next week.. These also include the label to stick on the outside of your box. (Lists of acceptable items should be on display in your churches today.) If you haven’t got a suitable shoebox to cover with Christmas

paper then you will be able pick up a ‘flat-pack’ one in your church. **There is one important change this year – please note that sweets and toothpaste are no longer acceptable as shoebox items.** The main reason for this decision is that it is a Customs requirement in some countries. Last year OCC had to pay a £16,000 fine to get 88,000 shoeboxes released in one country because their Customs wanted to know the date and contents of the toothpaste!

If you enjoy knitting and would like to make some items to go in the boxes then it’s time to get ‘clicking’. If you need a pattern for a hat, scarf, pencil case, finger puppet or small handbag – or have any other query– then let me know on 714632 or [svharvey@btinternet.com](mailto:svharvey@btinternet.com)

Each shoebox needs to be accompanied by a donation of £5 towards the distribution costs. If you are unable to fill a shoebox perhaps you could consider making a financial contribution toward this or the cost of the boxes.
