* RESTORE AND REBUILD – A POST ABORTION HEALING COURSE *

Achor is running another post abortion healing course starting on Thursday 20 September 2018 at 7.30 pm. It will be held in a home in Woking over 9 sessions plus one whole Saturday. They ran their first course using the *Restore and Rebuild* material last autumn and said it was thrilling to see God working in the lives of those attending.

Restore and Rebuild is a course is for women who have been through one or more abortions, are Christians, and who wish to receive healing and restoration in this area of their lives. The course offers a safe place for women to share their experiences in a small group setting and, step-by-step, work though different emotions and consequences following an abortion. Confidentiality is always respected.

Achor says "Many of those who had an abortion when they were Christians tell us that they feel that they have lost their faith or feel distant from God. We recommend that you come on the course even if you feel unsure about your faith. We will not judge you. We seek to welcome you into a warm, loving group with God's grace in Christ. Even if you feel far from God at the moment, come as you are now."
