

* SHORT TERM ACCOMMODATION FOR REFUGEES *

Could you, or someone you know, offer temporary accommodation to a destitute asylum seeker or refugee? *Refugees at Home* need volunteer hosts for homeless refugees during or after the processing of their asylum applications. The aim is to provide accommodation for a few weeks or months as their legal issues are sorted out and they can get back on their feet and become self-supporting.

There is currently an emergency call out for a Tunisian in his 30s who desperately needs a place to stay for a few months. M is deaf, and uses BSL. He understands basic written English - but basically sign language is how he communicates. He is a refused asylum seeker working to sort out his immigration status, with great support from the British Red Cross. He has recently been admitted to a mental health ward when it all got too much but his psychiatrist is clear that his crisis was strongly linked to uncertainty about what will happen next & his hearing problems.

Do you have a spare room? Can you help? Do you know someone who could?
