REV BEV'S REFLECTION

Caring for God's Creation

On this harvest Sunday we come before God with humility and gratitude for his goodness, and for entrusting the environment to us to *'till and keep'* (Genesis 2:15). Therefore, as stewards of the earth's resources we are responsible for *'Caring for God's Creation'*. However, the BBC1 programme *'Drowning in Plastics'*, and the Clergy Study Day on Tuesday to consider the impact of *'Climate Change'*, indicate that we have fallen short of our responsibility *"to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth"* – (the 5th Mark of Mission). This failure has devastated the lives of many, including birds and fishes, as well as some of the most disadvantaged people on the earth. Ever hopeful and trusting in God's promises (2 *Thessalonians* 2.16, 17), we can become wise tenants of God's kingdom and safeguard his creation.
