But what I really want to reflect on is the sheer number of people that made it to the different services and events organised by the three Churches throughout the parish in the month of December. I was overwhelmed by the large turnout in all three of our carol services, the Christingle service and the Guide Dog service at St Peter's among other events. I never thought we could ever have that many people at St Mark's and All Souls' like we did for both carol services. This got me thinking, and two things came to mind;

- ♦ What a great opportunity to share the Gospel. Witnessing to Christ, the one whom we celebrate is not only done in the pulpit, it can be done in our welcome, in our serving coffees and teas (Or mulled wine), and in those conversations before, during and after the services. It's my prayer that as we embark on the theme of 'Following Jesus' as a Parish, we can even be more well equipped with taking these opportunities to share the Gospel with people just like some of those we had over this past Christmas.
