MICK'S MUSINGS

I was reading recently of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Strange perhaps seeing that it is Advent and we are already thinking of Christmas. Yet there is a similarity in the two events. Both speak of humility and peace, both speak of the fact that it is an unusual way for a King to arrive in order to set up a Kingdom. When I am reading a well-known passage I look for a phrase or sentence that I have not noticed before. It was the phrase "The Lord needs it" that struck me. Jesus needed a donkey in order to show that He came to set up a Kingdom of humility and peace. Jesus was born in very humble circumstances to show that unlike other kings his Kingdom was to be different, one of humility and peace. Achieved in the hearts of people by this death and resurrection. He did this by His humble birth and riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. Today His Kingdom is extended in a similar way, not impressive, not irresistible, but by people like us passing on the good news of Jesus. So Jesus still needs donkeys to establish His Kingdom in the hearts of people. If there is failure to set up His Kingdom, it is our failure to be His donkeys and carry Him and His message to others.

Christmas, by the way, is a good time to do some "donkey work".
