* OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - SHOEBOX SUNDAY - 1 NOVEMBER 2020 *

Details of what can (and cannot) be included in the boxes are given in the leaflets that are now available in the churches, together with flat-pack shoeboxes. Each shoebox needs to be accompanied by a donation of £5 to cover distribution costs etc. If you are unable to fill a shoebox perhaps you could consider making a financial contribution towards this or the cost of the flat-pack boxes.

Filling your shoebox

Select a quality toy such as a doll, toy truck, deflated football and pump or a cuddly toy. Then pack the box full with other fun toys, hygiene items and school supplies. All items should be new. . New for this year! Hand-made or knitted stuffed toys can be included, providing they are stuffed with commercial stuffing and not, for example, old stockings or beans.

Full details are also available on the OCC website - https://www.samaritans-purse.org.uk/what-we-do/operation-christmas-child/ where you can also find details of how to pack a box online, choosing the gifts that you would like to be included and a video that shows how excited the children are when they receive a box. Each online shoebox costs £20, which includes the £5 for shipping and distribution costs.
