

* RACHEL'S RAMBLINGS *

As I write this just before New Year's Eve, I remember that this time last year I heard the bittersweet news that my grandmother had died in her sleep aged 102. I couldn't have imagined that Covid-19 would come to cast a much greater shadow over 2020. Yet, as with my grandmother's death, when I look back over the year I see so many sparks of light within the darkness: the pleasure of going for a walk and hearing the birds singing their hearts out; the exhilaration of finally finding flour for sale (!); the delight of worshiping in new ways and with new people; the joy of finding fresh insights into familiar Bible stories of exile and restoration. As we look ahead to 2021, and the difficult weeks that are undoubtedly in store, we put our hope in a vaccine but even more so in God, who is faithful today as much as he was when these words were written 2500 years ago.

"I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall. I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me.
