

* OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOXES *



We are again participating this year and our boxes need to be ready by Sunday 31 October. Details of what can (and cannot) be included in the boxes are given in the leaflets that are now available in all our churches. Each shoebox needs to be accompanied by a donation of £5 towards the shipping and

distribution costs. If you are unable to fill a shoebox perhaps you could consider making a financial contribution toward this or the cost of the boxes. <u>Filling your shoebox</u> Select a quality toy such as a doll, toy truck, deflated football and pump or a cuddly toy. Then pack the box full with other fun toys, hygiene items and school supplies, knitted hats and scarves. All items should be new. Hand-made or knitted stuffed toys can now be included, providing they are stuffed with commercial stuffing and not, for example, old stockings or beans.

<u>Please don't include:</u> Used or damaged items; clothing other than as suggested; war related items such as toy guns, play soldiers or knives; chocolate, sweets or other food items; seeds; aerosols; toothpaste, lotions or liquids of any type including bubbles; medicines; playing cards of the 4-suit variety; anything of a political, racial or religious nature; sharp objects; glass containers or fragile items; books with mainly words. (Items packed from this list will have to be removed from shoeboxes.)

You can also find details on their website of how to pack a box online, choosing the gifts that you would like to be included. Each online shoebox costs £20, which includes the £5 for shipping and distribution costs..

- 2. **Give by standing order** set up a standing order with your bank to give regularly to the parish, weekly, monthly, quarterly or annually. If you are a tax payer please fill out a Gift Aid form so our Gift Aid secretary can claim it back. Standing order and Gift Aid forms are available in each church
- 3. **Give in the weekly collection in church** you can put cash or a cheque made payable to 'The Parish of St Peter Woking' in the collection plate on Sunday and if you are a tax payer use the white envelopes at the back of each church. We hope to get a card reader at St Peter's soon to enable debit/credit card transactions. If you have not been to church for a while but are able to give please send to the Parish Office or contact Allen our treasurer and we will arrange to collect it.
