

* VICAR'S VIEW *

One of the aspects of daily Morning Prayer I enjoy is reading through the Psalms, especially with other people. Last week we were reading Psalms 52 and 59, which, amongst others, are written by David when he is being pursued by enemies and in fear for his life. Although, thankfully, none of us in our country face this, we are probably feeling pursued by COVID, especially the Omicron variant, which is causing us to be anxious either about catching it and being ill or the restrictions to our freedoms that it is bringing.

Fear is a very human emotion, but one that as Christians doesn't have to overwhelm us. We don't need to be afraid of the future, whatever it may bring, because as Psalm 23 says God promises to walk with us through those dark valleys and ultimately to lead us to green pastures if we allow him to be our shepherd rather than trying to live in our own strength with our own values and priorities rather than God's.

I know that is easier said than done, but through prayer and regular fellowship with other Christians whether in church, Connect Groups or Morning Prayer we can be encouraged by the God whose perfect love casts out all fear. I'm praying for you all at this unsettling time.
