* VICAR'S VIEW *

At a study day for clergy this week we were looking at power dynamics in leadership including the abuse of power, something that is prevalent in all forms of leadership, sadly including the church. One of the talks was entitled Gentle Leadership, which doesn't sound very inspiring! However, 'gentleness' in Greek means strength under control and is about safe, purposeful, but un-controlling leadership. It is about leading with vision, but allowing people to flourish using their own gifts, rather than being forced into the mould of the leader.

Most of us lead in some sphere, whether a group, in our family, or with certain friends, so ask yourself whether you follow Jesus' example and are a gentle leader.

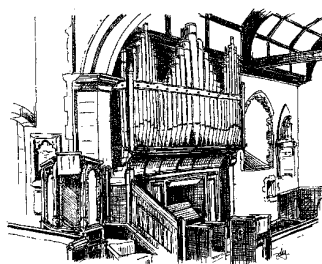


* ST PETER'S CHURCH CLEANING - NEW *
