# \* ENVIRONMENT TIP OF THE MONTH – NEW \*

Food and general plastic packaging come with what appears to be a bewildering array of recycling symbols. Some are quite easy to interpret and simply state "Recycle" or "Don't Recycle". It is the symbol that



consists of a broken triangle with a number 1 -7 at its centre that have confused me the most. Except for the broken triangle with either the number 3 or 6 at its centre all other items of plastic packaging displaying the broken triangle can be recycled. A number 3 at the centre of the broken triangle indicates that the packaging material is PVC and number 6 that it is polystyrene. Both cannot easily be recycled. Chris Heisig
