



* VICAR'S VIEW *

I reluctantly took up running again over the summer after Mason, our foster child, left us, feeling I needed to get a bit fitter and do something constructive with the extra time I now had rather than just stay in bed a bit longer! It's always hard motivating myself to go for a run and it always hurts about a minute into running, but the feeling when it's over is one of achievement and although I'm in some pain my body feels invigorated.

The saying 'No gain without pain' is very true, whether in exercise or almost any walk of life. It's true spiritually too. Setting aside time to read your Bible and pray, come to church, give generously to God's work, serve him in a form of ministry, share your faith all require some form of 'pain', maybe a hurdle to overcome, a giving up of 'free time', an increase of vulnerability etc. But my experience is that it is because we go through pain and make sacrifices for God that he blesses us and enriches our lives.

And God encourages us in these times, as he did Joshua before he entered the Promised Land.

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)
