



* VICAR'S VIEW *

The news I received this week that Mick Moorse had died hit me hard, as I know it has many of you. I have known Mick for nearly nine years as a much-valued colleague in ministry here in this parish. Mick had so many good qualities, but what stood out for me was his passion for people to know Jesus and the salvation that he brings, because Jesus had brought him so much joy, peace and purpose and assurance of his eternal salvation. He was often coming up with suggestions of how we as churches could share the good news of Jesus with people in this parish and his sermons

share the good news of Jesus with people in this parish and his sermons always brought out that passion. In recent years Mick suffered greatly with a cancer diagnosis, Pat's Alzheimer's and the stroke which affected his movement so much. Like Job his suffering made him ask big questions of his faith, which helped strengthen it and which he talked about in a wonderful sermon last May.

There is so much more which can be said about Mick and the influence for good he had on so many lives which will come out during his funeral and in conversations over the next few weeks. But today I want to acknowledge the shared grief that so many of us have. We have lost a wonderful person, a committed, loving, wise and generous priest to this parish and it affects us deeply. We thank God for him and his ministry, but we miss him and he leaves a hole in our hearts and in this parish.

Mick was always giving me ideas for sermon series and last year, no doubt with eternity on his mind, he was behind our August series on the Resurrection and our Advent series on the Second Coming of Jesus.

So although we grieve together, as Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 4:13–14 "We do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope. For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him." We share with Mick that hope of the resurrection to eternal life for all who believe in Jesus as their saviour and we look forward with confidence to seeing Mick, and Pat, again one day. In the meantime let's remember Mick with great joy, share our stories and emotions, and encourage one another in our hope in Christ.

If you are not in a Connect Group and would like to join one of the groups running it, starting week beginning 9 January please contact Jonathan or a Connect Group leader.


