* ENVIRONMENT TIP OF THE MONTH – NEW *

One of the best ways to reduce your carbon footprint is to use your car less, whatever type of car you have. It is very hard breaking longstanding habits, so ask yourself before each journey you would have taken by car: "Can I walk, cycle or take public transport?" It may take longer, though not always, may be less convenient and public transport may be more expensive (though not always), and even if you don't do it every time set yourself a goal of making one or two journeys a week less by car.

Otherwise ask yourself "Can I offer someone a lift going to the same meeting or service, or can I ask for a lift?" We should be a church where nobody ever feels awkward or take offence asking or offering and where are car parks are empty for the right reasons! Jonathan

* JENNY'S JOTTINGS *

The passage that I am preaching on at All Soul's this week is 1 Corinthians 1: 1–9. When I first saw this on the service rota, my first response was to be a little nervous. What is there to say about Paul's opening greetings? I know I am often guilty of skimming through these first sections of letters in the New Testament to get to the main 'meat' of the letter.

But on studying this passage more closely and reading what other people had to say about it, I discovered so much more to this passage. Paul packs a lot into these nine short verses – important messages both for the church in Corinth, and for us today – as I'm sure will be unpacked across all of the services.

However, this has been a good reminder to me, that the whole Bible is worth reading. Even the little sections that might seem insignificant. So let's not skim through them – but really explore what is being said.
