

# \* LUCY'S LETTER \*

I've been into three different schools and a nursery in the last week to tell the Easter story to children aged between 2 and 11. It's been a harder task than I anticipated, and I've really grappled with the theology of Jesus' death and resurrection as I've been thinking about how to communicate the message with these wonderful young people. When the children are really little, I've told them: "It's a really sad story at times, but don't worry – there is good news at the end!" and I've been wondering if that is what we need to hear sometimes, too.

We all go through sad bits in life, and the Holy Week story takes us to a very sad place indeed. But there is good news at the end: there is hope, there is resurrection, there is life. However the Holy Week story tells us that we are not to skip ahead to the joy: we first have the sorrow of Good Friday and the bleak waiting of Easter Saturday. These are important moments of despair, uncertainty and sadness written right into the heart of the Christian faith. God is with us in the difficult parts and promises us the hope of resurrection in the future. It's a really sad story at times, but don't worry – there is good news at the end!

# \* PCC HIGHLIGHTS \*

Some of the highlights from the last meeting are:

- ♦ The 2023 financial accounts were presented and approved. They show a small £4,000 surplus, which is encouraging, mainly due to an increase in calculation of Gift Aid owed.
- Approval was given for a Community Garden at St Mark's, which Lucy is organising with a team from church and the local community. Plans will be presented to St Mark's DCC in May.
- ♦ A modified service pattern to start in June was agreed. More details will be given after Easter, but key differences are:
  - A new monthly service 'Wild Church' at St Mark's in the afternoon aimed at attracting new people. This will be instead of a morning service at St Mark's on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month
  - Replacing Morning Worship with Holy Communion at St Peter's on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month
  - A Morning Worship service at St Peter's on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month, replacing Energise Plus. Energise will continue and will meet in the Church Centre.
