

* ECO-TIP FOR JANUARY - LITTER - NEW *

We regularly have litter blowing into our front drive which I hate and which is damaging for the environment and potentially dangerous to wildlife. Also litter attracts other people to drop litter there, so it is good to keep places litter-free. Like many other environmental issues we can see it as someone else's problem – people shouldn't drop litter or the council should pick it all up, but we all have a part to play.

Some suggestions:

- 1) Purchase a litter picker they make picking up litter easier and safer and more fun (especially for children).
- 2) Take a bag with you when you go for a walk. You don't have to do a formal litter pick, just pick up anything you pass and dispose of it in a bin.
- 3) Join a litter picking group like the Woking Litter Warriors who can be found on Facebook or via an internet search. It is more enjoyable to do it with others and the groups are very friendly.
- 4) If you see anyone littering and you think it safe to do so then politely tell them and ask them to pick it up. Most people will feel embarrassed and respond by doing so.
