### \* ECO-TIP FOR MARCH - NEW \*

Do you consign that slightly limp lettuce or crinkly cucumber to the food waste bin when its past its "use by date" or worse still "best before date"? Do you bin that uneaten potato prepared for your evening meal? Approximately 10 million tonnes of food waste in the UK each year suggests that many of us do. It is estimated that this is responsible for releasing an additional 18 million tonnes of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere.

If you pride yourself on having good food preparation skills and recognise still edible food, then pass on those skills to others. Research suggests that Millennials (born between 1981 – 1996) closely followed by Gen Z (born between 1997 – 2012) are most likely to dispose of food when still edible. *Chris Heisig*

### \* LUCY'S LENTEN LETTER \*

Last week I led an assembly at Kingfield Primary school talking to the children about the upcoming season of Lent. I explained that it's a chance for Christians to get ready for Easter, as we remember Jesus in the desert for 40 days and nights as he got ready for the work that he had come to earth to do. I said that it's a chance for us to get closer to God, by giving up something to focus our minds, and devoting ourselves to spiritual practices more as we enter this special season and get ready to celebrate the highlight of our year: Easter!

I found myself increasingly excited as I explained all this to them: these ancient practices that mark out this season as different: an opportunity to lean into our faith and to know Jesus more deeply.

So what practices are you considering this Lent? Perhaps you are giving something up — something costly that will remind you of the season each time you miss it. And what new practices are you taking up? I'll be praying the Lord's prayer at midday each day (an alarm on my phone will remind me to do so!) and we'll do the Lent booklet as a family. Perhaps you might book yourself on a retreat day (local St Columba's House would love to have you) or go on a solitary walk. Perhaps you'll commit to joining us for Morning Prayer for one day a week, or sign up to the 40 acts of kindness resource by Stewardship. However you enter this season and whatever you choose to do, let's be expectant that we will leave the desert as changed people at Easter, ready for the work that God has laid before us.
