- ♦ We are working through a few things on our Net Zero Carbon plan including replacing lights in St Mark's with LED lights, looking at getting a grant towards loft insulation at St Mark's and putting new heaters in at All Souls'.
- ♦ The eco-church survey for St Mark's shows that we are not too far off obtaining the silver award so will be focusing on areas of development there over the next few months, especially around our community engagement and personal lifestyles.
